Two of them are a house mother and a house father caring for all needs of the children in the shelter. Another one is a security guard who looks for the safety of the people living at KiKu's place.

Additionally, there is a Centre Manager who is responsible for the management of the shelter.

Last but not least, there is an accountant who assists us with the bookkeeping in Ghana.

KiKu-Kinderhouse Kumasi

KiKu-Kinderhouse Kumasi is a registered non-profit organization with the vision to assist neglected and misused children in and around Kumasi. To do so, we are operating a children's shelter in the outskirts of Kumasi that is providing shelter for 24 children.

The shelter started operating in the beginning of 2015. Since then the shelter has been home to 89 children aged between 5 and 17 years.

Every child in the shelter is sent to school as soon as possible and is given the necessary medical treatment.

The children are looked after by four adults dedicated to make the children feel safe and loved from the moment they arrive in the shelter.

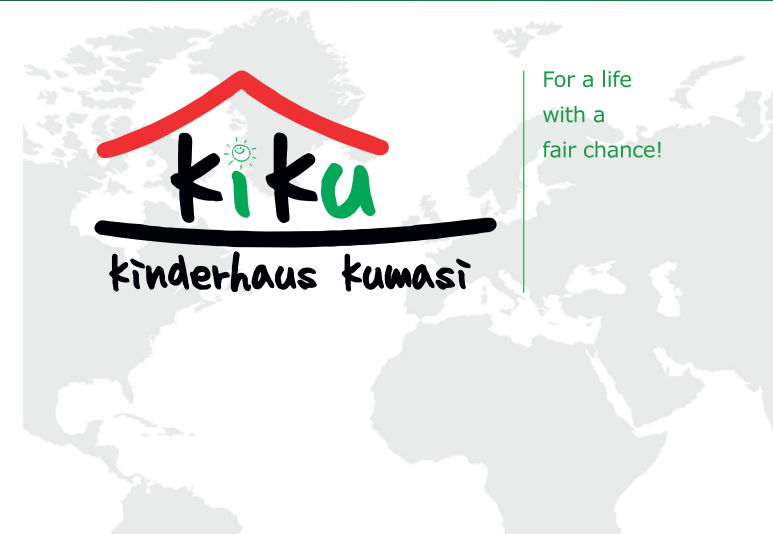
